UW MSE offers both Ph.D. and master's degree programs. Several students have successfully joined the Ph.D. program after completing the master's program. Additional training is available in clean energy, quantum materials, and data science.

The Ph.D. program is for students interested in academia, research and technique innovation careers. It provides students with the skills to conduct advanced research in development and applications of novel and new materials. Doctoral students conduct research under the supervision of each individual faculty supervisor.

The applied master's program is for students interested in pursuing a practice-oriented degree involving research project or internship with industry that culminates in a career in materials science and engineering or an advanced research degree in preparation for a Ph.D. The program is flexible, can be completed in as little as one year, or can be extended as most appropriate for the individual and their schedule.
